“Feed the Truck” is back. The Southwestern Virginia Second Harvest Food Bank announces its annual “Feed the Truck” food drive to be held June 28 – July 12. Non-perishable food donations may be dropped off at the “Feed the Truck” barrels located in 10 Food City stores throughout Southwest Virginia.

The collection of non-perishable food items such as cans of fruits and vegetables, and bags or boxes of cereals, rice or macaroni, will directly help those most in need in the community.

Gary Mitchell with Second Harvest says the need for food donations is always there. “Summertime, especially the July 4th holiday, is the perfect time for family picnics and cooking out. It is also the perfect time to consider others when you do your grocery shopping. Add a second can of baked beans or pasta to your shopping list and place your donations in the Feed the Truck barrels in select Food City stores.”

The Southwestern Virginia Second Harvest Food Bank, Northrop Grumman, Food City, and the Virginia Information Technologies Agency (VITA) are joining forces again to host “Feed the Truck.” This annual food drive is a continuation of the commitment Northrop Grumman and VITA have made to helping Southwest Virginians.
