ConnectVirginia

Health Information Exchange (HIE)

- Continue to sustain existing functionality through the Health Information Exchange
- Working with DHP on connecting the Prescription Monitoring Program
- Worked with VCU and other stakeholders recently to submit a grant application for end of life planning which involves connecting the Advance Health Care Directive Registry to the HIE
- In partnership with VDH, submitted a grant application for \$2.9M to build out the encounter alert service with “fetch” technology, etc. Other stakeholders include FQHC’s and several providers

All Payer Claims Database - Current Status

- Full access to APCD data through the MedInsight Analytics Platform has been provided to participating health plans, hospitals and to the Department of Health
- This represents one of the largest and fastest APCD implementations to date and a major achievement for health transparency in Virginia
- Participation in the State Innovation Model Grant - APCD data will be used to inform this grant as it pertains to population health and well being
- Data refresh - additional APCD (2nd load) data has been loaded into MedInsight. Claims data from 2 additional data submitters is now included. Several enhancements to the MedInsight platform have also been implemented
- We continue to work with the APCD Advisory Committee to develop an application process for APCD data. We are also working on what data fields would be available for backend access

Vital Records/Ancestry Project

- Project went live on June 2nd , 2015
- A press release and media event with Governor McAuliffe occurred at the Division of Vita Records on June 2nd
- This project digitizes over 16 million vital records, both public and non public
- In Virginia, death records are public after 100 years; marriage, divorce and death are public after 25 years
- This collaboration with Ancestry was created through 2012 legislation (SB660)
- The legislation called for an index of all records, both public and nonpublic
- For public records, all information is displayed along with an associated digital image
- For nonpublic records, only the name, location, date and event are displayed. No images are available

Vital Records/DMV Collaboration

- Phase 2 of this collaboration goes live in mid August
- At that time not only birth, but also death, marriage and divorce records will be available from 75 DMV locations and 5 DMV mobile units
- We will utilize the images created through the Ancestry/Vital Records project to inform the second phase of this project
- DMV will utilize a web service to query the Vital Records digital images and if an image is found, a certified copy of the record will be created from this image
- We are working with the Library of Virginia to store and archive these images on their archival system
- Beginning later this year, we will begin moving paper public records to the LVA

VDH Informatics Program

- VDH moving toward being a data-driven organization
- Establish executive data governance oversight group
- Establish data working groups utilizing existing data experts
- Determine data stewards
- Draft polices have been created for data consistency and peer review/vetting, data access and metadata collection. Each policy has an associated implementation guide
- Continue working on building out the informatics team – budget requests for additional FTE's

SIM Grant

- VDH is responsible for creating a population health plan - Dr. Levine is taking the lead on this
- Focus is on well-being beginning with infancy and early childhood - good health during this period results in healthier adults
- Accountable Care Communities are being created
- VDH is also in a lead role for creating the Health Information Technology for the SIM grant planning period. Debbie Condrey, Michael Matthews and Michael Lundberg have been working together on this
- A Health Information Needs Workgroup meeting was held on May 19th to discuss the HIT plan for the SIM grant
