Vision

 Improve citizen trust and engagement with Virginia government websites by providing modern, consistently-branded Commonwealth websites that are secure, Section 508 accessible and digitally responsive

Goals

- Improve the citizen user experience across all Commonwealth public-facing websites
- Brand Virginia state websites for a world-class look and feel that is easily recognizable
- Provide all citizens the ability to find information and execute needed services on Commonwealth websites by providing language options and accessibility support
- Build citizen trust in Commonwealth government websites by providing easily identifiable state websites, with a vigilant security posture and consistent .gov addresses
- Train Commonwealth of Virginia (COV) agencies and educational institutions on how to create modern websites and be a partner resource by providing templates, checklists, on-site demos, tools and scans
