



### A guide to the appliance rebate program

This month, Virginia, Maryland and the District will be rolling out energy-efficient appliance rebate programs. Residents who replace an old appliance with a new one can expect a check in the mail to cover part of the cost. Utility companies currently offer their own rebates on appliances, so in some instances, customers can expect to get twice the rebate. A warning, though: The federal government allotted only a certain amount of money for the program. As soon as the money runs out, the rebate program will end.

Here's what you need to know to get your rebate:

**When does the program start?**  
The program is slated to begin April 28. The Virginia Department of Mines, Minerals and Energy will announce the day on its Web site, as well as in a statewide advertising campaign. Customers must make a reservation on the Web site after the program starts and before they buy an appliance to ensure they have access to the rebate money.

**What appliances will be covered and how much will the federal rebate be?**

- Energy Star washing machine \$75
- Energy Star refrigerator \$50
- Energy Star air source heat pump \$300
- Energy Star storage gas water heater \$25
- Energy Star tankless gas water heater \$225
- Energy Star gas furnace \$250

**What documentation will be needed?**  
The utility companies will oversee rebates. Rebate forms may vary among companies and may require the purchase date, location, model number, proof of energy efficiency, and a signed statement verifying that the old appliance will no longer be used.

### On first day, thousands reserve rebates for appliances

Despite a late start and an early surge of requests for money, Virginia's appliance rebate program proceeded smoothly and still had plenty of cash available Wednesday evening, state officials said.

"It looks like it'll last for at least a week, if not weeks," said Al Christopher, director of the energy division of the state Department of Mines, Minerals and Energy, which is overseeing the federal Energy Efficient Appliance Rebate Program.

The slow pace of requests contrasted with the high demand that was expected and the experiences of other states, some of which sold out of rebates within hours.

The department launched the program, using \$7.45 million in federal stimulus funds, at 11 a.m. Wednesday. But its website took about 40 minutes to update with the link for rebate reservations.

A flurry of visitors tried to access the site at the moment the state was trying to reload the page with the application link, slowing a process that should have taken just a few minutes, Christopher said. By 11:40 or so, the reservation link appeared and allowed consumers to start signing up for rebates.

"We haven't had a problem with the application," he said. "It hasn't crashed."

Consumers can receive money back after purchasing an electric heat pump, gas furnace, tankless gas water heater, gas tank water heater, refrigerator or washing machine. The appliances must meet federal Energy Star standards for efficiency to qualify for a rebate.

For all but the gas equipment, consumers had to reserve a rebate on the department's website. Those who did have 60 days to buy the appliance.

As of 3 p.m. Wednesday, the state tallied reservations worth about \$300,000 for about 3,000 rebates.

For many hunters, tradition is one of the great lures of the sport.

One of those traditions is the annual trek to buy our licenses. The trip may give us a chance to browse through displays of the latest and greatest hunting goods. And maybe we'll run into a buddy or two who's doing the same thing.

As we all know, some traditions have a downside or two.

Who hasn't been frustrated standing in line while buying a license the night before opening day? No matter when we make the trip, it takes time. Many of us get a half-dozen different licenses, each of which must be filled out by a clerk.

Then there's the signature block, which seems impervious to ink. Has anyone been able to actually sign one of those things with a ballpoint pen?

The Department of Game and Inland Fisheries has for several years been trying to ease the process. For one thing, they want to install a computerized, electronic point-of-sale license system.

Budget woes have put those plans on hold, but the department did just implement another program that should please some license buyers.

Virginia hunting and fishing licenses are now available through the Internet.

Licenses remain available by phone through Bass Pro Shops and, of course, in person from license agents. Almost all licenses also may be purchased through the good old U.S. Mail.

#### a. Register as a seller of legal services plan

Pursuant to §59.1-441.1 et seq., Code of Virginia, sellers of legal services plans in Virginia must register with the Office of Consumer Affairs at the Virginia Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, regardless of previous licensing status with any other agency.

Payment of the registration fee is by VISA or MasterCard only. Credit cards from a third party other than the registering individual are accepted. If you do not have a VISA or MasterCard, please contact your head associate or your plan's corporate representative for further assistance. The registration fee is non-refundable.


